



We have increased the cost of these items to \$5.50 due to supplier cost increases. Combination noodles and teriyaki chicken and rice has also increased to \$6.00 due to supplier charges.

For children wanting vegetarian lunches, we have added the option of a fresh Brumby's cheese roll to our Brentwood Bites Lunchbox. This is a substitute for the cheddarmite scroll, and the box also contains a mini muffin, vanilla yoghurt, piece of fresh fruit (or fruit salad on Fridays) and choice of drink.

We still have some of our winter menu pumpkin soup and tomato basil soup in stock and these can continue to be ordered until stock runs out.

Thank you everyone for your continued support this year. It has been great seeing the children and some volunteers back at the canteen. 
Welcome back to school banking families back for term 4!
